DATE: AUGUST 24, 2021

ISSUE

Shall the City Council adopt Resolution No. 21-65, delegating to the City Manager, authority to administer and manage claims and actions against the City of Mendota or its officers or employees and claims and actions of the City of Mendota?

BACKGROUND

The City of Mendota is a member of the, CSJVRMA, Central San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority, a joint powers authority for risk management and insurance. The City receives claims from time to time and works closely with our insurance carrier to properly process the claims as expeditiously as possible. While there are some claims that require City Council action, many do not and in fact can be acted upon by the City Manager in consultation with the insurance carrier and/or the City Attorney when needed, so long as the City Council passes a resolution delegating that authority to the City Manager. Currently, there is a resolution on file that authorizes the City Manager to reject any claim up to \$50,000. Unfortunately, the current resolution solely provides the City Manager with the authority to reject claims but does not authorize the City Manager to allow, allow in part, settle, or compromise claims up to the same amount.

Granting the City Manager with the authority to allow, deny, allow in part, settle, or compromise a claim up to \$50,000 would allow claims that are minor in nature, typically related to vehicle accidents or property damage, to be settled in a prompt and expeditious manner.

ANALYSIS

The effect of delegating to the City Manager the authority to not only review and reject all claims up to \$50,000, but also have the authority to allow, allow in part, settle or compromise claims for up to \$50,000, will result in a faster response time to claims received, which in turn would give claimants shorter periods in which to file lawsuits to pursue their claims. Certain claims as recommended by the insurance carrier, including claim settlements over \$50,000, would be presented to City Council for action.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 21-65, delegating to the City Manager authority to administer and manage claims and actions against the City of Mendota or its officers or employees and claims and actions of the City of Mendota.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-65

WHEREAS, on October 11, 2016, the City Council of the City of Mendota (the "City") adopted a resolution numbered 16-71; and

WHEREAS, resolution number 16-71 only delegated the authority to the City Manger to reject claims for monetary damages pursuant to the California Tort Claims Act, Government Code Government Code, § 810, et seq. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, when presented with a claim, the City has a very short period within which to act on the claim, which in many instances renders the full consideration of a claim by the City Council impracticable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Mendota that:

- 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to allow, deny, allow in part, settle, or compromise any claims or action for money or damages against the City of Mendota or its officers or employees, provided its disposition is not otherwise directed by the City Council or by statute, ordinance, resolution, insurance policy, or self-insurance pooling agreement, subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The amount to be paid pursuant to such allowance, settlement, or compromise does not exceed \$50,000.
 - b. If the amount to be paid exceeds \$50,000, the approval of the City Council of the City of Mendota is first obtained.
 - c. The concurrence of the City Attorney is first obtained.
- 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to collect, settle, compromise, release, or dismiss any claim of the City of Mendota, provided its disposition is not otherwise directed by City Council or by statute, ordinance, resolution, insurance policy, or self-insurance pooling agreement, subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The amount of the claim does not exceed \$50,000 or, if it does, the amount to be paid is not less than ninety (90) percent of the amount of the claim.

- b. If the amount of the claim exceeds \$50,000, and the amount to be paid is less than ninety (90) percent of the amount of the claim, the approval of the City Council of the City of Mendota is first obtained.
- c. The concurrence of the City Attorney is first obtained.
- 3. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to perform all functions of the City Council of the City of Mendota which are provided for in Part 3 (commencing with Section 900) and Part 4 (commencing with Section 940) Division 3.6, Title 1, California Government Code, or, if applicable, Municipal Code, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth above.

Shall the City Council reject the application for leave to file a late claim on behalf of two claimants that was received by the City of Mendota, and direct the Director of Administrative Services/ Assistant City Manager to send a notice of rejection of the application to the claimant's representative?

BACKGROUND

The City of Mendota is a member of the, CSJVRMA, Central San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority, a joint powers authority for risk management and insurance. As a part of the CSJVRMA, AIMS is the City's designated liability and worker's compensation insurance carrier. The City receives claims from time to time and works closely with our insurance carrier to properly process the claims as expeditiously as possible.

On August 29, 2020 a vehicle accident occurred for which two late claims against the City of Mendota were received on July 26, 2021, attached as exhibit "A", along with an application for leave to file a late claim on behalf of both claimants.

ANALYSIS

Based upon the investigation conducted by the City's insurance carrier AIMS, the City should not have any liability exposure for the subject accident because the two claims were filed late with the City. AIMS recommends that the City Council reject the application for leave to file a late claim received on behalf the two claimants.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 21-66, rejecting the application for leave to file a late claim on behalf of both claimants, and directing the Director of Administrative Services/ Assistant City Manager to send a notice of rejection of the application to the claimant's representative.

ISSUE

Should the City Council adopt Resolution No. 21-68, authorizing the placement of special assessments on the 2022-2023 tax roll for 2021 nuisance abatement costs?

BACKGROUND

City of Mendota Code Enforcement has performed abatements on properties within the City with weeds on them constituting a public nuisance. A total of two (2) properties were forcibly abated.

Following a first "initial" notice and a second "courtesy" notice, properties were checked for compliance, and if they still failed were informed that if they did not comply, the City would proceed with a forced abatement. While some property owners abated the nuisance on their own, those that did not do so were forcefully abated by a private contractor hired by the City.

ANALYSIS

The attached resolution includes the cost that will be assessed to each parcel to recover City costs incurred through abatement proceedings. The Cost Report and Summary attached to the resolution was submitted and filed with the City Clerk. All detected properties were abated before the 4th of July holiday in order to decrease the risk of a destructive fire on those properties. This is what is being considered by Council to be added to the 2021 tax rolls.

In accordance with the Mendota Municipal Code, a notice of this public hearing was posted on each property and mailed to each property owner impacted. The notice of the public hearing was also posted on the kiosk outside City Hall. Letters were also mailed out to the property owners detailing the amount that is owed, notifying them that they have the ability to pay the abatement costs prior to the assessment and that they also have the right to submit a written or oral protest before or during the public hearing at this Council meeting.

Staff recommends that the City Council discuss the item, invite members of the public to comment on the matter, and consider the attached resolution for adoption. Once the City Council adopts the resolution, staff will be able to move forward with placing the abatement assessments on the 2022-2023 tax roll. Each property owner will have the corresponding amount described in the Cost Report and Summary levied on their upcoming property tax bill and will be required to remit payment.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approximately \$4,698.68 spent to abate, which will be recovered by assessing the property owners on their property tax bills.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 21-68, authorizing the placement of special assessments on the 2022-2023 tax roll for 2021 nuisance abatement costs.

CODE TO ESTABLISH A BUSINESS LICENSE FEE FOR LESSORS OF REAL PROPERTY

DATE: AUGUST 24, 2021

ISSUE

Should the City Council perform the second hearing, hold the public hearing, and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 21-15, adding Section 5.08.266 to Chapter 5.08 of Title 5 of the Mendota Municipal Code to establish a business license fee for lessors of real property?

BACKGROUND

The City Council has previously discussed the possibility of establishing a business license and license fee for lessors of real property for the purposes of regulating such business types. California statutory authorizes the City of Mendota ("City") to license any lawful business for purposes of regulation and authorizes taxation for such licenses.

At its August 10th regular meeting, the City Council held the first reading for the ordinance and scheduled the public hearing for the August 24th City Council meeting.

ANALYSIS

The establishment of a business license for lessors of real property will allow the City to better regulate this business type by ensuring that each lessor maintains the appropriate documents to lease property and will improve the personal safety for residents by ensuring active management.

The attached ordinance establishes a business license for this type of business and will also establish an appropriate license fee. Lessors must acquire a business license and pay for each license annually. The proposed fees have been calculated by staff to recapture the estimated costs of processing business license applications, issuing business licenses, and then enforcing compliance with health, safety, and license requirements. Given that various employees within the Finance Department and Code Enforcement Department would play a role in this process and that hourly rates of these employees vary, the calculations include the average of the hourly rate of the employees within that particular department. The staff calculations are listed below:

License Processing and Issuing (1 License)

Should lessors own more than one rental property, they would be required to apply and pay for a separate license for each rental property. In estimating costs, staff has determined that the cost associated with processing and issuing the second and subsequent licenses would be less since staff will be conducting the majority of the documentation processing as they process the first business license. As such, the calculations for the fees for the second and subsequent licenses for lessors who lease more than one property are as follows:

Based on all calculations, the attached ordinance proposes an annual businesses license fee of \$188 for one license and a fee of \$52 for the second and subsequent licenses. The lessor would also be required to pay for any additional business license fees that is required by the State of California (currently an additional \$4).

FISCAL IMPACT

Revenue generated from the business license fees will be offset by associated administrative and enforcement costs. Therefore, no fiscal impact is anticipated.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council discuss the proposed ordinance, perform the second hearing, hold the public hearing, and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 21-15, adding Section 5.08.266 to Chapter 5.08 of Title 5 of the Mendota Municipal Code to establish a business license fee for lessors of real property.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-15

WHEREAS, the City of Mendota ("City") is responsible for enforcing laws and regulations to promote the health and safety of the City's residents; and

WHEREAS, California Constitutional and statutory authority authorizes the City to license any lawful business for regulation purposes and authorizes reasonable regulatory charges to defray the City's costs for regulating such licenses (See Cal. Const. Art. XI, § 7; Cal. Const. Art. XIIIC, § 1, subd. (e); Gov. Code, § 37101; Bus. & Prof. Code, § 16000, et seq.); and

WHEREAS, City staff has prepared a report, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference, outlining the City's expected costs of issuing and regulating these licenses to ensure the license fee charged is reasonable and limited to defraying the City's costs of regulation; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City to license and regulate those lessors carrying on the business of providing rental housing to promote the health and safety of the City's residents by ensuring each lessor maintains the appropriate documents to lease property and promoting active property management; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined the Mendota Municipal Code requires revisions to align with these policy goals.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Mendota does ordain as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and by this reference made an operative part hereof.

Section 2. Section 5.08.266 is hereby added to Chapter 5.08 of Title 5 of the Mendota Municipal Code to read as follows:

5.08.266 – Lessors of Residential Real Property

Property owners engaged in the business of providing rental residential dwellings, excepting owner-occupied rental residential dwellings therefrom, shall pay an annual license fee in the following amounts:

- A. <u>One hundred eighty-eight dollars (\$188.00) for the first rental</u> residential dwelling per year; and
- B. <u>Fifty-two dollars (\$52.00) for the second and each additional rental residential dwelling per year.</u>

Section 3. Severability. If any part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and the City Council hereby declares that it would have passed the remainder of this Ordinance, as if such invalid portion thereof had been deleted.

Section 4. The City Council hereby finds and determines that its adoption of this Ordinance is not subject to environmental review under the Public Resources Code, § 21000 et seq., the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), because the amendments do not have the potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment and therefore are not considered a "project" under CEQA. (Pub. Res. Code, § 21065; 14 Cal. Code Regs., § 15378(a).)

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage.

<u>Section 6.</u> The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance and will see that it is published and posted in the manner required by law.


