

MINUTES OF MENDOTA SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING

June 7, 2023

Meeting called to order by Mayor Martinez at 4:01 p.m.

Roll Call

A motion was made by Council Member Riofrio to adopt the agenda, seconded by Council Member Rosales; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

CITIZENS ORAL AND WRITTEN PRESENTATIONS

BUSINESS

1. Council discussion and consideration of the City of Mendota's list of upcoming street projects

Mayor Martinez introduced the item and City Engineer Osborn provided the report.

Discussion was held on the report provided by City Engineer Osborn; the street repair project list that will be funded by Senate Bill 1 ("SB1"), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017; the different types of funding that can be used for street repair projects; the City applying for federal funding to repair portions of Marie and Divisadero Streets; utilizing local funds to repair portions of Tule, Jennings, and Quince Streets; potentially receiving assistance from the County of Fresno for street repair projects; the timeline of the proposed street repair projects; available Environmental Protection Agency Grants; the roundabout project at the intersection of State Highways 180 and 33 and McCabe Avenue; installing additional street lights throughout the City; the status of the all-inclusive playground at Rojas-Pierce Park and the Mendota General Transaction and Use Tax.

A motion was made by Council Member Rosales to direct staff to update the street repair project list that will be funded by SB1 and/or local street funds to include portions of 4th, Lolita, Jennings, Quince, and Tule Streets, apply for federal funding to repair Divisadero and Marie Streets, and initiate the planning process for the street repair projects, seconded by Council Member Alonso; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

With no more business to be brought before the Council, a motion for adjournment was made at 4:53 p.m. by Council Member Rosales, seconded by Council Member Alonso; unanimously approved (5 ayes).
