## MINUTES OF MENDOTA REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Regular Meeting October 10, 2017

Meeting called to order by Mayor Castro at 6:01 p.m.

**Roll Call**

Flag salute led by Fresno County Sheriff's Deputy Oscar Rivas.

Invocation led by Reverend Karen Stoffers-Pugh from Wesley United Methodist Church.

#### FINALIZE THE AGENDA

City Manager DiMaggio requested that Consent Calendar item #4 be tabled to the next regular meeting.

A motion was made by Councilor Silva to adopt the agenda as modified by staff, seconded by Councilor Mendoza; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

#### **SWEARING IN**

1. Deputy City Clerk Cabrera to swear in Officer Bryan Creed.

Deputy City Clerk Cabrera swore in Officer Creed.

Police Chief Andreotti shared Officer Creed's background.

Council congratulated Officer Creed and wished him well.

At 6:09 p.m. Mayor Castro announced that there would be a quick recess.

At 6:12 p.m. the Council convened in open session.

#### **PRESENTATION**

1. Ivette Rodriguez from Mid Valley Disposal to present the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter update.

Ivette Rodriguez from Mid Valley Disposal (MVD) presented the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter update including the results of the annual report for disposal; the results of the commercial and multi-family site visits; the results of the residential assessments; various community events that MVD has attended; the results of the spring clean-up event; provided information on commercial and residential tonnage percentages; and presented the Recycler of the Year award to Sorenson Machine Works.

Discussion was held on reducing overflowing garbage bins; issues with illegal dumping; and whether residents can be required to acquire additional bins if there is a need.

**Harry Hansen (Sorenson Machine Works)** – stated that the City should provide a location for individuals to dispose of large items year-round.

Discussion was held on the possibility of having additional community clean-up events.

#### CITIZENS ORAL AND WRITTEN PRESENTATIONS

**Kevin Romero (160 Tuft Street)** – provided an update on Mendota High School Aztecs football.

Discussion was held on the upcoming football games.

A motion was made by Councilor Rosales to adopt items 1 through 3, 5, and 7 of the Consent Calendar, seconded by Councilor Mendoza; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

6. Proposed adoption of **Resolution No. 17-59**, directing the City Manager to execute Certificates of Cooperation as part of Federal Grant Applications.

Discussion was held on the purpose of the certificate; the certificate being an additional submittal to the COPS grant and other federal grants; the deadline to submit the COPS grant; whether the certificate conflicts with SB 54; and how the police department will perform their duties as a result of signing of the certificate.

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Martinez to adopt item 6 of the Consent Calendar, seconded by Councilor Rosales; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

#### **BUSINESS**

1. Appointment of an Alternate Planning Commissioner.

Mayor Castro introduced the item and Economic Development Manager Flood summarized the report including that the Council appointed Mr. Jose Gutierrez to the Planning Commission at its previous meeting; that the Council decided to continue the appointment of the alternate planning commissioner; that neither of the applicants were present; and stated that staff contacted Ms. Meza to inform her that the alternate planning commission position was the only position available on the Planning Commission.

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Martinez to appoint Mr. Jose Alonso for the position of alternate planning commissioner, seconded by Councilor Silva; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

Code Enforcement & Police Department
 a) Monthly Report

Police Chief Andreotti summarized the report for the police department including a conference that some officers attended; events that the department participated in and will participate in; the explorers taking a tour of the Fresno County Jail; and provided a personnel update.

Police Chief Andreotti summarized the report for the code enforcement department including that the officers are making a lot of contact with the community; working on vehicle abatements; and addressing residences with nuisances.

Discussion was held on whether it was acceptable for officers to go through a certified FTO program with another agency; the usage of all-terrain vehicles near the city's baseball diamond; and the presence of Fresno County sheriff's deputies in the city.

Economic Development Manager Flood reported that there are numerous residents that are interested in opening a business, and reported that he is working with the New Mendota Chamber of Commerce to plan the 2017 Mendota Business Summit.

3. City Attorney a) Update

City Attorney Kinsey stated that he is working with staff on various issues.

#### 3. City Manager

City Manager DiMaggio reported that the sub-committee on the wastewater treatment tertiary treatment project met; provided an update on the project; and stated that he would not be present for the October 24<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting.

Discussion was held on the status of road projects, and whether businesses are taking advantage of the cannabis overlay district.



#### **DISCUSSION:**

Your Council is aware that the City and KSA Investments have been steadily working through recording and developing small phases of the Las Palmas development in northwest Mendota. Phase 8 was recently approved by your Council and recorded. Staff is currently working with KS and their engineer to complete the Phase 9 map and improvement drawings. This is the final phase of the map.

In order to complete the map as approved by the City, some work needs to be done to clean up the property line between the City and KSA. The City owns most of the storm drain basin east of the subdivision, except for the 37,220 SF area shown in green below, which still belongs to KSA. The City also owns the 2,599 SF triangular area shown in violet, which is within the boundary of Phase 9 of Las Palmas. In order to record the map, KSA must own the violet triangle. Staff proposes to grant the triangle to KSA in exchange for the green area.



Because the City requires KSA to get title insurance on the entire subdivision boundary before the map is recorded, he must actually take title to the triangle before the map is approved. This item will accomplish that action. The City will receive the green area after the map is recorded, and that will be secured by a provision in the grant deed requiring KSA to grant the green area to the City by March 2018. If they fail to do that, the purple area reverts to the City.

A legal description and grant deed for the 2,599 SF parcel are attached to this item.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

No direct fiscal impact. The City will gain approximately 35,000 square feet of land in the complete transaction, though no money will be involved.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that that City Council adopts Resolution No. 17-57, granting the 2,599 SF parcel to KSA Investments, and authorize the City Manager to sign the attached deed and all necessary documents to record the grant with the County of Fresno.

- **WHEREAS**, to allow Owner to complete the Las Palmas Tract, and to provide the City ownership of the entire storm drain basin land, it is in the best interest of the City, and for the common benefit, for the City to transfer title to the City Parcel to the Owner, and for the Owner to transfer title to the Owner Parcel to the City
- WHEREAS, the City shall not issue any building permits on lots created by the Phase 9 map until such time as the City has received title, free and clear of any monetary encumbrances, to the Owner Parcel, and



TO ALLOW COBRAS FOOTBALL TEAM TO USE BASEBALL FIELD FOR PRACTICE.

**DATE:** OCTOBER 24, 2017

#### **ISSUE**

Shall the Council approve an Exclusive Use Permit from Westside Youth, Inc. (WYC) to use the baseball field for Cobra Football practices?

#### **BACKGROUND**

Staff received a request from WYC to use the outfield portion of the baseball field for holding practice for the Cobras football team, principally to take advantage of the lights since the changing of daylight savings time will cause the sun to set at an earlier time.

According to the application submitted (attached to this report), they would need to start using it as soon as possible, Monday through Thursday from 5:30pm to 7:30pm until November 16<sup>th</sup>. Last year the Council provided direction to the City Manager to approve the use.

Generally these requests would go to the Recreation Commission. However, the time period in which the field is requested to be used commences before its next regular meeting, which would give the City Manager the ability to approve or deny the application. In this case, because of previous declarations made by the Recreation Commission to limit the use of the field to children's baseball and softball, and the costs incurred by the City in allowing such a use, the City Manager deemed that it would not be appropriate for him to make a determination.

#### **ANALYSIS**

The Recreation Commission has, on various occasions, expressed its intent to limit the type of activity that goes on at the requested facility so as to preserve its condition as much as possible. It is especially vital to keep cleats off of the grass during these fall and winter months in which the grass retains more moisture, making it more susceptible to damage by cleats. Additionally, during a time when the City is implementing austere measures in order to safeguard the budget, the operation of the lights without compensation creates a cost that would rather be avoided.

Concerning a recommendation, staff sees the benefit of allowing the youth to practice at the

baseball field but remains neutral because of the many costs noted above related to such a use. If it is Council's desire to approve the use, staff recommends that the usual conditions of approval for our local non-profit organizations be applied: 1) receipt by the City of a \$250 security deposit (refundable once the use is over and verification has been made as to the condition of the facilities) before the field is used, and 2) that WYC maintain and repair the field based on their use and immediately report any observed problems, whether or not caused directly by their use, to the Director of Public Works or his designee.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

Undetermined cost to the City related to the use of lights, staff time, and other issues related to wear and tear of the facility.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Council discuss the issues related to the use and either deny the application or approve it with the above conditions.

#### STREETS AND ROADS

• Street sweeping continues as usual.

- Construction continues on the 7th and Derrick Realignment project. Paving has been delayed due to unforeseeable issues with the sign. The date of completion for all work is November 22nd.
- Construction on 8th Street is near completion. Paving and striping are complete.
- City crews continue to conduct road maintenance throughout the city.

#### PARKS AND PUBLIC BUILDINGS

• Public Works continues to maintain the parks for the community.

#### **DRINKING WATER**

- Meter reads are complete.
- Staff is working with the consultant that is providing bond counsel opinion, in order to move forward with the City's Automated Meter Reader project.

#### **WASTE WATER**

- Monthly samples have been submitted.
- Crews continue to transfer water from semi-full ponds to shallow empty ponds to provide capacity for the upcoming winter months. Grinding from the both street projects were used at the waste water treatment plant to shore up the basins.

- Lozano lift station improvement project will go out to bid next month. Once bids are received staff will bring forward a recommendation for approval to the City Council.
- Staff met with members from UC Davis and the Council for Watershed Health to began work on identifying storm water improvement projects that can be submitted for Prop 1 monies in the summer. This effort is being financed through a 311,000 Prop 1 planning grant that the City was awarded.
