

ISSUE

Should the Council authorize the Mayor to sign a letter of support to encourage expansion of the Migrant and Seasonal Head Start (MSHS) program?

BACKGROUND

The Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo County, Inc. (CAPSLO) sent a request for a letter of support to expand their Migrant and Seasonal Head Start services from being offered 6 months out of the year to 9-10 months. The letter requesting the City Council's support is attached.

ANALYSIS

SUBJECT: CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT FOR JULY 2016
DATE: AUGUST 9, 2016

In the month of July, Code Enforcement continued to wrap up the weed abatement process and focus on abandoned or wrecked vehicles, water conservation, and other property/zoning violations. The last step for weed abatement will be a cost report that will necessitate a public hearing, most likely in September, so that the costs can be assessed to the respective property owners.

Code Enforcement's focus on wrecked and abandoned vehicles is a result of the importance of keeping our community looking clean and beautiful, as well as ensuring that such vehicles do not become a fire hazard or attractive nuisance on which children or others could become injured. We recognize that many in the community prefer to do their own mechanic work; however that does not allow them to ignore the requirements of complying with the law. They must store and work on their vehicles in compliance with zoning and other Mendota Municipal Code (MMC) requirements.

Water conservation continues to be stressed and Code Enforcement officers continue to reach out to residents and businesses that do not comply.

Lastly, please let the public know that if they have any issue related to health and safety that is a violation of the MMC (or that they believe may *possibly* be a violation of the MMC), please have them call the non-emergency dispatch number at (559) 655-4294. If a Code Enforcement officer is on duty, they will respond as soon as possible. If a Code Enforcement officer is not on duty, the Police Department will then receive the call and it will be answered according to their priority protocol.

A tip line for Code Enforcement will be coming shortly. This line is not for calling in immediate needs as it will not be answered by a live person and will only be checked once a day. It will be for residents to report anonymously on ongoing problems, such as a house that has an illegally constructed section in which a lot of people are inhabiting or an abandoned vehicle that they have noticed for a while.

**** NOTE: During the armed robbery investigation at a local store on 7th Street Officers discovered there were a number of citizens outside the store who were in clear sight of the incident and witnessed the suspects entering and exiting the business. Amazingly, not one person called 911 to report the crime or came forward to Police that night or during the following days to provide information. Fortunately, Officers were able to identify and then locate some of these witnesses. Unfortunately, none were able to provide any significant information.**
