# MINUTES MENDOTA PUBLIC SAFETY SUB-COMMITTEE MEETING August 3, 2020 12:00 NOON Mendota City Hall

# I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Martinez at 12:00 p.m.
