MINUTES OF MENDOTA REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Regular Meeting

October 24, 2023

Meeting called to order by Mayor Martinez at 6:00 PM.

Roll Call

Council Members Present: Mayor Victor Martinez, Mayor Pro Tem Libertad “Liberty” Lopez, Council Members Jose Alonso and Joseph Riofrio

Council Members Absent: Council Member Oscar Rosales

Flag salute led by Council Member Joseph Riofrio

A moment of silence was held in honor of Javier Alonzo Zambrano who recently passed away.

Invocation led by Police Chaplain Robert Salinas

FINALIZE THE AGENDA

1. Adjustments to Agenda.
2. Adoption of final Agenda.

A motion was made by Council Member Riofrio to adopt the agenda, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez; unanimously approved (4 ayes, absent: Rosales).

CITIZENS ORAL AND WRITTEN PRESENTATIONS

Jonathan Meza expressed his concerns over the Vista Square Shopping Center (“Vista Square”) not opening within the timeframe that was previously agreed upon, including the possibility of this being a breach of contract; commented on an unpermitted event that recently took place at Vista Square; and on a lack of communication and transparency between the Vista Square owner and businesses who will occupy the building.

audio and video systems in the new Police Station and Council Chambers; authorizing the City Manager to execute all documents necessary therefor.

Mayor Martinez introduced the item and City Clerk Cabrera-Garcia provided the report.

John Graham with Sound Contracting presented information on the installation of the audio and video systems (the “systems”) in the new Police Station and Council Chambers and provided information on Sound Contracting’s background, including various projects completed by the company.

Discussion was held on the information provided by City Clerk Cabrera-Garcia and Mr. Graham with Sound Contracting, including on the life expectancy of the systems that will be installed at the new Police Station and Council Chambers.

Mayor Martinez opened the public comment period at 6:24 p.m. and seeing no one willing to comment closed it within the same minute.

A motion was made by Council Member Riofrio to adopt Resolution No. 23-73, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez; unanimously approved (4 ayes, absent: Rosales).

2. Council discussion and consideration of **Resolution No. 23-74**, approving the \$130,037.35 proposals submitted by Surveillance Integration for the installation of the access control system and the video security system in the new Police Station and Council Chambers; authorizing the City Manager to execute all documents necessary therefor.

Mayor Martinez introduced the item and Chief of Police Smith provided the report.

Jim Richardson with Surveillance Integration presented information on the installation of the access control system and the video security system (the “systems”) in the new Police Station and Council Chambers; provided information on Surveillance Integration’s background, including various projects completed by the company; commented on the life expectancy of the systems; and on the benefits of having these types of systems in the new Police Station and Council Chambers.

Discussion was held on the information presented by Mr. Richardson with Surveillance Integration; on the differences between cloud-based software systems and server-based software systems; the importance of equipping the new Police Station and Council Chambers with state of the art technology; the Mendota Unified School District’s use of the same security system; on how frequently the systems are vandalized; continued expansion of the systems throughout the City; and on the Mendota Police Department’s use of body cams.

Mayor Martinez opened the public comment period.

Albert Escobedo commented on his support of the systems and on the need to keep the community safe.

Joseph Amador inquired into how monitoring of the security system will work.

Discussion was held on the inquiry made by Mr. Amador, including details on how monitoring of the security system works; on Pool Park being selected as one of the location sites for the security system; and on continued expansion of the security system throughout the City.

Mayor Pro Tem Lopez left the Council Chambers at 6:51 p.m. and returned within the same minute.

Brian Gonzalez commented on illegal street racing occurring throughout the City and inquired into whether the systems will assist with enforcement.

Discussion was held on the comments made by Mr. Gonzalez.

Jonathan Leiva commented on the security system's ability to differentiate between different objects in order to not set off any false alarms.

Discussion was held on the comments made by Mr. Leiva.

Mayor Martinez closed the public comment period.

A motion was made by Council Member Riofrio to adopt Resolution No. 23-74, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez; unanimously approved (4 ayes, absent: Rosales).

3. Council discussion and consideration of **Resolution No. 23-75**, approving the \$115,270.10 proposal submitted by Surveillance Integration for the installation of community video policing infrastructure; authorizing the City Manager to execute all documents necessary therefor.

Mayor Martinez introduced the item and Chief of Police Smith provided the report.

Discussion was held on the report provided by Chief of Police Smith.

Mayor Martinez opened the public comment period and seeing no one willing to comment closed it within the same minute.

A motion was made by Council Member Alonso to adopt Resolution No. 23-75, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez; unanimously approved (4 ayes, absent: Rosales).

4. Council discussion and consideration of **Resolution No. 23-76**, approving the \$79,600.00 proposal submitted by Howell Communications for the purchase and installation of a self-supporting communications tower at the new Police Station and

Council Chambers; authorizing the City Manager to execute all documents necessary therefor.

Mayor Martinez introduced the item and Chief of Police Smith provided the report.

Discussion was held on the report provided by Chief Smith, including the possibility of using the proposed self-supporting communications tower to provide free internet services to the community.

Mayor Martinez opened the public comment period at 7:07 p.m. and seeing no one willing to comment closed it within the same minute.

A motion was made by Council Member Riofrio to adopt Resolution No. 23-74, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lopez; unanimously approved (4 ayes, absent: Rosales).

DEPARTMENT REPORTS AND INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

1. Animal Control, Code Enforcement, and Police Department
 - a) Update

Chief Smith provided the monthly update for the Animal Control, Code Enforcement, and Police Departments including ongoing tasks; participation in upcoming community events and commented on Adelante Mendota's Car Show.

Discussion was held on the update provided by Chief Smith, including the Mendota Police Department's ("MPD's) work to address public drinking in the City; the need to address noise violations throughout the City and a recent statutory rape victim and the MPD connecting them with the RCS Fresno – Carmen Meza Center.

2. City Attorney

Assistant City Attorney Castro provided an update on ongoing tasks and projects, including a presentation he provided to the City's Finance Department and Code Enforcement Department regarding new mobile vendor regulations.

Discussion was held on new mobile vendor regulations; tables and chairs being permanently set up at locations of mobile food vendors, including the possibility of this being a public nuisance violation and the City Council's desired direction on how to address these issues and on loud music being played by businesses throughout the City.

3. City Manager

City Manager Gonzalez commented on new mobile food vendor regulations, including giving businesses a notice to ensure that they comply with the new mobile food vendor regulations; thanked City staff for their work and those who attended the meeting, and commented on the Police Department and City Council Chambers project.

Mayor Pro Tem Lopez commented on her attendance to the 32nd Annual Westside Red Ribbon Carnival and Parade held in Tranquility on October 22nd; on public drinking occurring at the location of mobile food vendors throughout the City; inquired into the possibility of providing the City Council meeting agendas in Spanish; and thanked City staff for their work and those who attended the meeting.

Council Member Alonso commented on a meeting held with Community Schools Program Coordinator Jennifer Jasso; on the possibility of attending a League of California Cities City Leaders Summit in April; thanked those in attendance for the moment of silence held in honor of his uncle who recently passed away and thanked City staff and the MPD for their work.

Discussion was held on the comments made by Council Member Alonso.

2. Mayor

Mayor Martinez thanked those who attended the meeting; commented on a meeting he held with Congress Member John Duarte; on ongoing projects occurring throughout the City, including a new soccer field, road repair projects, and Mendota Municipal Code updates, and encouraged community members to attend City Council meetings.

ISSUE

BACKGROUND

The City of Mendota (“City”) Public Works Department (the “Department”) is responsible for maintaining public facilities, including parks, sports facilities, and public rights-of-way.

ANALYSIS

To effectively perform its duties, the Department needs two (2) new lawn mowers. In accordance with Mendota Municipal Code Section 2.48.110, on October 24, 2023, the City issued an Invitation for Bids (“IFB”) for the purchase of two (2) new Toro Z Master 6000 Series with a 60” Cutting Deck Lawnmowers. On October 27, 2023, a public notice inviting bids was published with The Business Journal notifying all interested parties to submit bids in response to the IFB. A bid opening was held on November 7, 2023, and the City received one (1) bid by the deadline, with RGPOWER submitting the lowest responsive and responsible bid in the total amount of \$32,155.23.

FISCAL IMPACT

A total of \$32,155.23 from the General Fund (Buildings and Grounds) will be expended for the item. A total of \$32,000.00 was approved in the 2023-2024 fiscal year budget. An additional \$155.23 needs to be authorized by the City Council to effectuate the purchase.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 23-78, approving the bid submitted by RGPOWER for the purchase of lawn mowers for the Public Works Department.

ISSUE

Who is responsible for the maintenance and repair of sanitary sewer laterals within the City of Mendota?

BACKGROUND

Occasionally, City staff will receive a request from a property owner to assist with the maintenance or repair of their property’s sanitary sewer lateral. Sanitary sewer lateral repairs could include a broken pipe and maintenance could include removal of a blockage due to tree root intrusion or other foreign objects.

The City’s current policy is that ownership, maintenance, and repairs to the sanitary sewer laterals are the sole responsibility of the owner of the property served by that pipe.

ANALYSIS

Per Chapter 13.08 – Sewer Service System of the Mendota Municipal Code “‘public sewer’ means and includes any sewer other than a house connection sewer,” and a “‘house connection sewer’ means and includes that part of the horizontal piping beginning twelve (12) inches from the exterior of any building and extending to and including its connection with the public sewer.” By this definition, sewer laterals (“house connections”) are not part of the “public sewer,” which shows sewer laterals are private and that the property owner bears the responsibility for maintaining, repairing, or replacing the pipe.

It does not appear that any State codes (i.e., Public Utilities Code, Health & Safety Code, etc.) further define the public/private delineation of house connections, rather it is left to the municipalities and districts to determine. Some cities will use the curb line as the delineation of public versus private responsibility; some use the right-of-way line; while others may offer reimbursement for the full length from the public main to the building. The City of Clovis explicitly puts the ownership, maintenance, and repairs of the entire lateral on the property owner (City of Clovis Municipal Code Chapter 6.4.06).

It should be noted that repairs or replacement do require a connection permit from the City.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City under current policy related to sanitary sewer laterals.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that no changes occur to the current Municipal Code or policy related to sanitary sewer laterals.
