# **ADOPTION OF MINUTES**

The minutes for the meeting of August 7, 2017 were approved based on a motion made, seconded and approval.

## II. <u>BUSINESS</u>

- 1. Chairperson Silva
  - a) Installing speed limit signs on Highway 180 and Belmont Avenue

Chairperson Silva introduced the item and reported that he has received complaints of people speeding on the 180 coming into town.

Discussion was held on the posted speed limit of 35 miles per hour; the different speed tests that have been carried out and the possibility of the posted speed limit being increased if future speed tests determine it is merited; the enforcement that is carried out; and the effectiveness of feedback speed limit signs.

b) Bus causing traffic jam when picking up kids on Smoot Street

Chairperson Silva introduced the item and explained that in the morning and afternoon a bus turns from Sorensen onto Smoot to pick up children, impeding the flow of traffic

for a significant amount of time; and the possibility of using the community center parking lots for the loading and unloading of children.

c) Red painted curb on Smoot Street

Chairperson Silva introduced the item and explained that certain parts of Smoot Street have the curb painted red and that it is not necessary.

Discussion was held on the parking issues that happen during the Open Market.

- 3. Code Enforcement
  a) Monthly Update

Chief of Police Andreotti reported on issues at 902 Riofrio Circle, including that his department has facilitated its transfer of ownership to the Office of the Public Administrator; that the Office of the Public Administrator will clean it up, and plan to sell it; violations for vehicles illegally stored on the roadway or on private property; the importance of maintaining the City clean and beautified; and the reduction in staff due to budgetary constraints.

4. Police Departmenta) Monthly Update

Chief of Police Andreotti reported that there were hardly any violent crimes reported; the Sheriff's department assisting them with patrolling; and staffing reductions due to budgetary constraints.

Discussion was held on how to make a golf-cart street legal.

5. Other Business

Rosie Corrales with the Fresno Housing Authority reported on issues that they have dealt with in their organization, and that they have some housing available.

Ilse Guerrero with Centro la Familia reported on events and activities that they have promoted and held in Mendota.

Warden Bruce Plumley of FCI-Mendota reported on their recent activities, and the amount of inmates and staff they currently have.
