

A motion was made by Commissioner Ochoa to adopt the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Gonzalez; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

Commission consensus was reached to appoint Commissioner Silva as Chairperson of the Recreation Commission.

Deputy City Clerk Cabrera-Garcia opened the nomination period for the office of Vice-Chairperson.

Chairperson Silva nominated Commissioner Ochoa for the office of Vice-Chairperson.

Deputy City Clerk Cabrera-Garcia closed the nomination period for the office of Vice-Chairperson

Commission consensus was reached to appoint Commissioner Ochoa as Vice-Chairperson of the Recreation Commission.

CITIZENS ORAL AND WRITTEN PRESENTATIONS

Sergio Valdez (325 Pucheu Street) - commented on the condition of the Benny Mares Sr. baseball field, and the improvements that needed to be done to it.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES AND NOTICE OF WAIVING READING

1. Approval of the minutes of the regular meeting of September 6, 2018.
2. Notice of waiving the reading of all resolutions introduced and/or adopted under this agenda.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gonzalez to approve items 1 and 2, seconded by Vice-Chairperson Ochoa; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

BUSINESS

1. Commission discussion on a softball league organized and managed by a separate organization.

Chairperson Silva introduced the item and clarification was provided in regards to the item involving a proposed youth baseball league and not a softball league.

Dino Perez (Westside Youth Center, Inc. [WYC]) – stated that the organization was approached by a group of individuals that wanted to put together a youth baseball league; that WYC will be supporting the new baseball league which is managed by a committee within the organization; and stated that WYC had submitted a facility-use application for the use of the Benny Mares Sr. baseball field.

Discussion was held on the process of considering facility-use applications that are for the use of the baseball field or any City Facility for recreational purposes; working with the school district so that the proposed league may possibly be able to utilize their

baseball fields; the age group that the program is for; the days and times that the program is requesting to use the baseball field; and the need for the City to expand its recreational facilities.

Jesus Martinez (298 S. Kate Street) – inquired on whether the City planned to expand its recreational facilities.

At 12:21 p.m. Chairperson Silva stated that there would be a brief recess.

At 12:25 p.m. the Commission reconvened in open session.

2. Commission discussion on potential Pool Park improvements.

Chairperson Silva introduced the item and requested that staff look into opportunities available for improving Pool Park, including the possibility of creating a rodeo grounds at the park.

Discussion was held on the ownership of Pool Park; creating additional recreational facilities at the park; public safety issues at the park; the possibility of making park improvements, including the installation of additional lights and the creation of a walking trail; and searching and applying for grants that fund park improvement projects.

Commission provided direction to staff to look into potential Pool Park improvements and funding opportunities, and report back to the Commission at a future meeting.

3. Commission discussion on the process to request the use of City Facilities for recreational purposes.

Chairperson Silva introduced the item.

Discussion was held on the Commission considering facility-use applications for the use of City Facilities for recreational purposes at its March 7th meeting.

4. Commission receive an update on the Rojas-Pierce Park expansion project

Chairperson Silva introduced the item and City Manager Gonzalez provided an update on the Rojas-Pierce Park expansion project, including the funding that will be provided by the developer of the La Colonia development per the development agreement; the creation of a new baseball diamond and soccer field; the timeline of the project; and that staff is searching and applying for grants that could fund the construction of a new community center.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS AND INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Deputy City Clerk Cabrera-Garcia reported that there were two vacancies on the Recreation Commission and that any interested individuals could pick up an application

at City Hall.

ADJOURNMENT

At the hour of 12:48 p.m., with no more business to be brought before the Commission, a motion for adjournment was made by Commissioner Alonso, with a second by Vice-Chairperson Ochoa; unanimously approved (5 ayes).

ISSUE

Shall the Recreation Commission approve the exclusive use permit for City facilities requested to be used for recreation purposes?

BACKGROUND

Every year in March the Recreation Commission considers any requests made before the February deadline for the use of the baseball diamond or any City Facility for athletic or sport purposes. While this is not the only time in which individuals and groups can submit applications, the ones submitted in February for consideration at this March meeting have priority over those submitted later. Additionally, those submitted at a later date will be approved or denied by the City Manager.

Staff received two applications before the deadline, which are attached.

ANALYSIS

The two applications received request the use of the Benny Mares Sr. Baseball Field for youth baseball. They are:

- An application received from Westside Youth, Inc. to use the baseball field from April 18th, April 20th, and April 25th, with Thursday times being from 4:30pm to 7:00pm and Saturdays from 10:00am to 2:30pm. They are not charging an entry fee, declining the use of the snack bar, and will not need the lights, due to their scheduled end time being more than thirty minutes before sunset.
- An application received from Mendota Youth Baseball to use the field from the period of March 15th to July 15th, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 4:00pm to 9:00pm and Saturdays from 9:00am to 5:00pm. They plan to charge an admission fee of \$.50 and will use the snack bar and lights, when necessary.

While these requests interfere with each other, staff recommends that the Recreation Commission approve both requests with the condition that Mendota Youth Baseball cede the use of the field for the three days Westside Youth, Inc. requests it. It should be early enough for Mendota Youth Baseball to arrange their schedule to accommodate this and is a show of communal consideration.

Otherwise, the Commission is free to take comment from both of these organizations and other members of the public, then come to an alternate decision that would better benefit the community.

FISCAL IMPACT

As attached (Exhibit A), the fees charged would only be those related to the concession stand use, which would be \$10 for every half day, to be paid before each organization starts use of the field. In addition there will need to be an administrative security deposit paid by both organizations (before their respective use of the field) of \$250, which is refundable once their use ceases and it is confirmed that the facilities are intact in their original state.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Commission approve the use of the Benny Mares Sr. Baseball Field as requested in the attached applications with the following conditions:

1. Mendota Youth Baseball cede the use of the field to Westside Youth, Inc. on the days the latter has requested it;
2. Both organizations provide the city with any updates to its schedule, including any changes that occur mid-season that cause the field to be un-used when it was previously declared it would be used;
3. Both organizations pay the necessary fees and/or deposits, based on their submitted schedules, before beginning use of the field, as well as providing proof of insurance and any other information the City Manager may request;
4. Both organizations maintain the field based on their use and immediately report any observed problems, whether or not caused directly by their use, to the Director of Public Works or his designee.
